Innovation and Growth at MMHCA



Since November 2023, your MMHCA Board has tirelessly fought for Michigan Licensed Professional Counselors. From providing invaluable resources to addressing critical issues, our board has delivered measurable impact for our members. Here's how we've been working for you!

Continuity in Advocacy: MMHCA continues to work with Acuitas, Michigan's leading lobbying firm, to advocate for LPCs and ensure their voices are heard in Lansing.

New Branding Strategy: MMHCA developed a cohesive branding strategy to better represent the vision and values of our association.

New Committees Established: Focused on Education, Outreach, and Legislative Advocacy to address the evolving needs of LPCs.

Brand-New Website: Launched an updated, user-friendly platform at www.MMHCAnow.org to provide members with easy access to resources, updates, and events.



Legislative Actions

These efforts include tackling Medicaid and insurance clawbacks, examining Compact policies, and evaluating the impact of private equity firms like Alma, BetterHelp, and Headway on client care and data privacy. The MMHCA Board is also exploring how AI may reshape traditional care models.



Medicaid Involvement

In recent months, we've partnered with Meridian Medicaid leadership to address systemic challenges. Outcomes include workshops for members and progress toward improved reimbursement practices.



Health Innovations

MMHCA spearheaded training on integrating mental health counseling into medical settings through "Incident To" billing, ensuring LPCs play a critical role in innovative healthcare delivery.

Collaborative Efforts Promote Change:

Our partnerships with the National Association of Social Workers - Michigan and other professional organizations have driven collective advocacy for key legislative changes, including insurance parity and enhanced supervision practices.



Enhancing Patient Care Through Legislation:

Advocated for policy changes enabling LPCs to bill Medicare, ensuring LPC services are accessible to underserved populations. MMHCA also hosted the 2024 Medicare Workshop, attended by 200+ members, to educate LPCs on billing updates.



Tracking Legislative Impact:

MMHCA continuously evaluates the impact of our advocacy through surveys, town halls, and member feedback ensuring member needs are prioritized in every legislative push.

Networking events ensure graduate students connect with LPCs, offering the support they need to succeed as they transition into their professional careers.

Complimentary monthly sessions for LPCs to explore real-world counseling challenges, share insights, and receive peer support.

Supervisor Peer Consultation Groups:

Designed to assist supervisors in addressing challenges, sharing strategies, and enhancing mentoring capabilities.

Student Inclusion:

Graduate students are welcome to gain exposure to the counseling profession and engage in real-world problem-solving.

Podcast Launch: Addressing Pet Loss Grief

MMHCA launched its debut podcast, exploring the deeply personal and often overlooked topic of grief from pet loss.

These events promote collaboration, mentorship, and the development of meaningful professional relationships among LPCs, supervisors, and students statewide.

These events are tailored to support students transitioning into professional practice, providing mentorship, licensure guidance, and opportunities to connect with experienced LPCs.

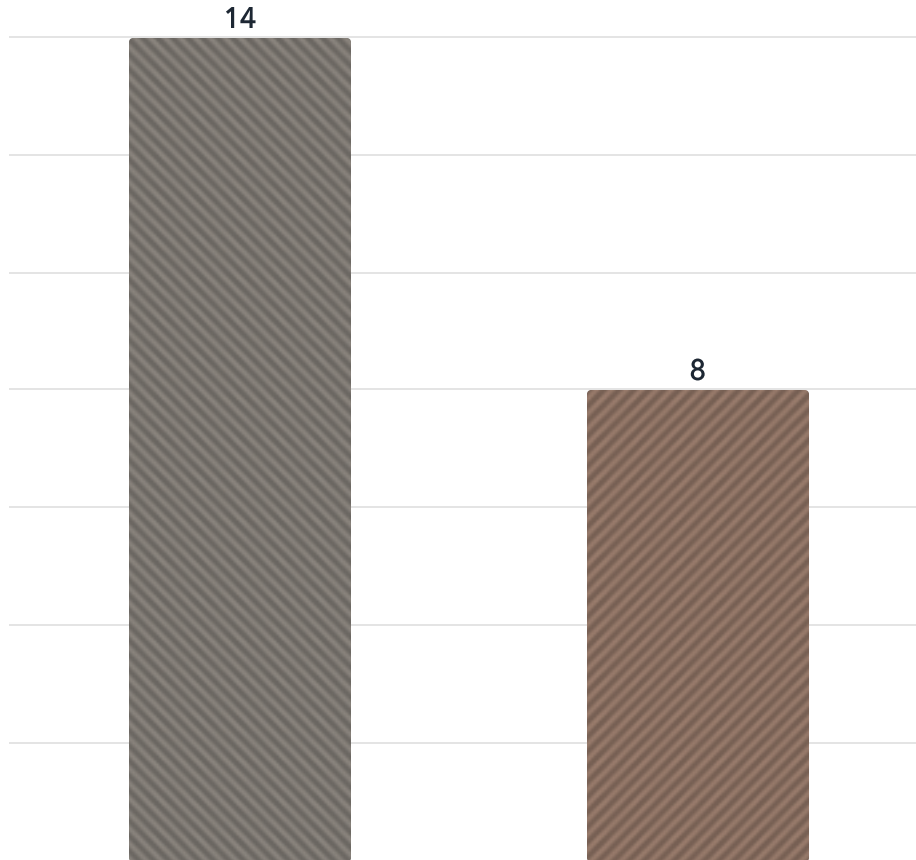

Transparency in Action:

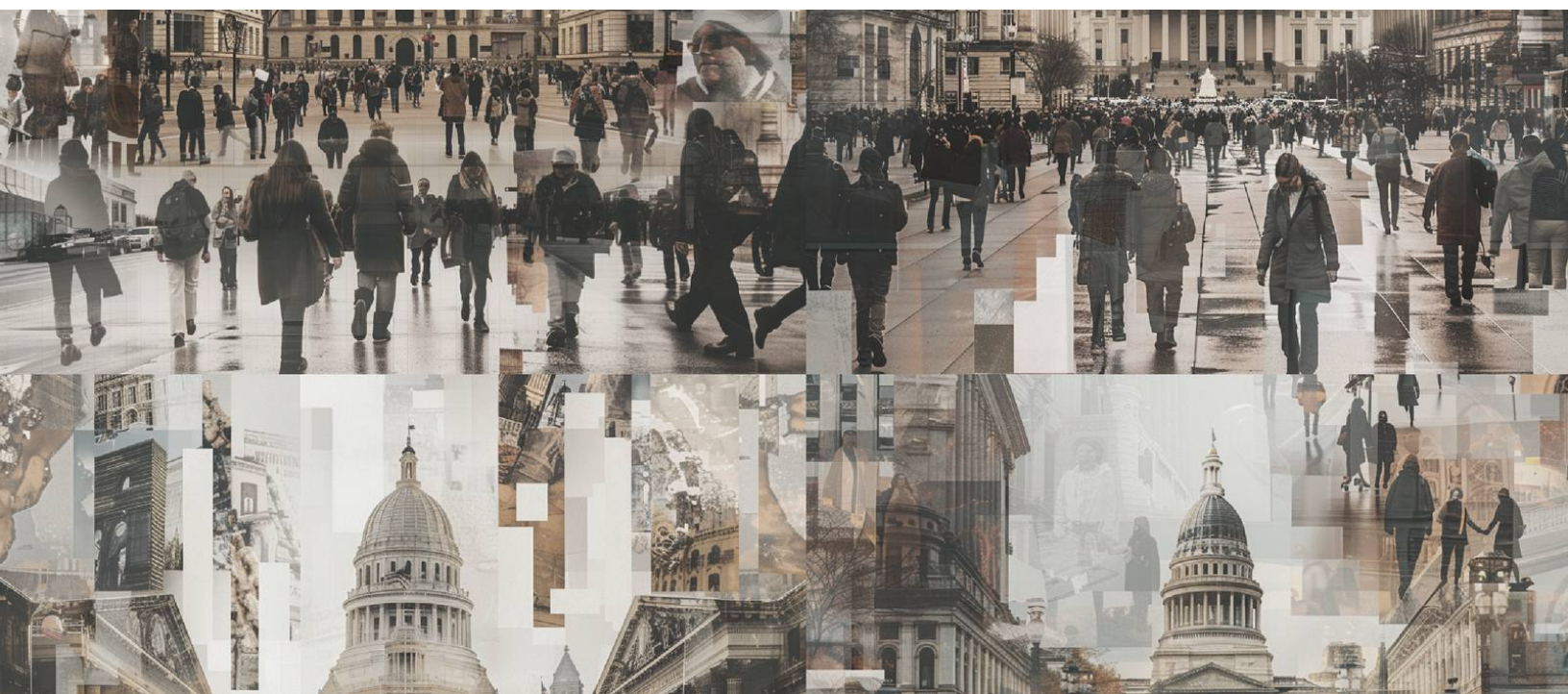


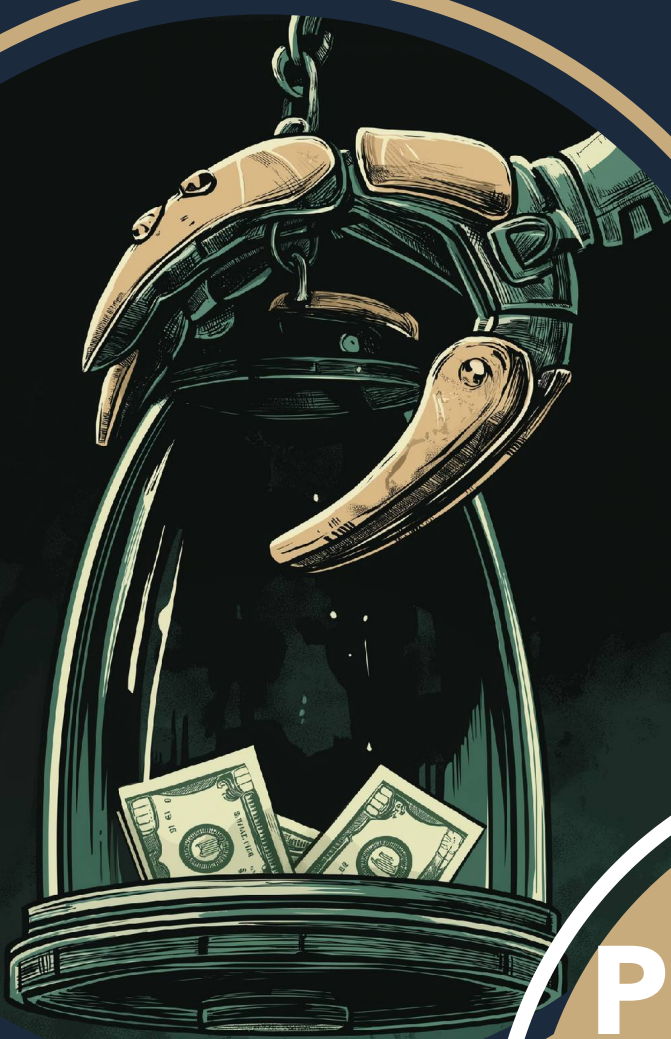
Board meetings recorded and published with full transparency.

Protecting LPCs from Insurance Takebacks

MMHCA recognizes the financial challenges posed by insurance clawbacks and has made this issue a top priority. We've partnered with Acuitas, Michigan's leading lobbying firm, and joined forces with the **National Association of Social Workers - Michigan (NASW-MI)** to address this critical issue.

- Collaboration with NASW-MI: Joint efforts to create equitable legislation and prevent unjust financial burdens on mental health professionals.
- Legislative Advocacy: Engaging with lawmakers and stakeholders to draft policies that protect LPCs and improve reimbursement practices.
- Member Resources: Regular updates on progress and workshops to educate members on minimizing take-back risks. Our top 2025 priority!

Supporting Michigan Counselors with Impactful Advocacy and Outreach

Advocacy Accomplishments

- **Key Legislative Interventions:** MMHCA has successfully intervened to protect LPC rights and advance the profession, including efforts to address insurance clawbacks and insurance parity.
- **Partnership with Medicaid Leadership:** Collaborating with Meridian Medicaid leadership to improve reimbursement processes and member support.
- **Representation in National Advocacy:** MMHCA Board members and our lobbyist actively participate in the Counseling Compact Commissioners' Meetings, advocating for Michigan counselors' inclusion in nationwide policy changes.

Engagement and Outreach

- **72 New Social Media Followers:** In just 90 days, MMHCA has expanded its reach and community online.
- **17 Educational Posts:** Shared vital updates and resources for member support.
- **913 Social Media Reactions:** Reflecting active engagement and interest in our shared content.
- **Top Post Performance:** The Pathway to Counseling Licensure in Michigan infographic garnered 551 reactions and 20 replies, a testament to its value.

Training and Professional Development

- **14 Monthly Board Meetings:** Publicly accessible with full transparency through YouTube recordings.
- **200+ Members Trained:** Attended workshops on Medicare, practice management, and supervision strategies.
- **Monthly Supervisor Member Consultation Groups:** Supporting supervisors with ongoing professional development and resources.
- **Free Conference Access:** Sponsored members' admission to the Psychiatry Reimagined Conference (June 2024).

Collaborations and Partnerships:

- **Partnered with NASW-MI:** Joint efforts to tackle critical issues like insurance clawbacks and meeting with legislators to promote vital understanding.
- **Supported by Acuitas Lobbying Firm:** MMHCA's trusted advocate since 2018, instrumental in passing HB 4325 and advancing LPC rights.
- **Student Engagement:** Published Bridging Newsletters and hosted networking events to connect students and professionals.

Member-Centered Initiatives:

- **Members Engaged:** Reached through monthly newsletters packed with resources and updates.
- **Survey Responses:** Acted on feedback from our November 2023 and May 2024 surveys to meet member needs better.
- **Town Hall Transparency:** Hosted open discussions to share progress and hear directly from members.
